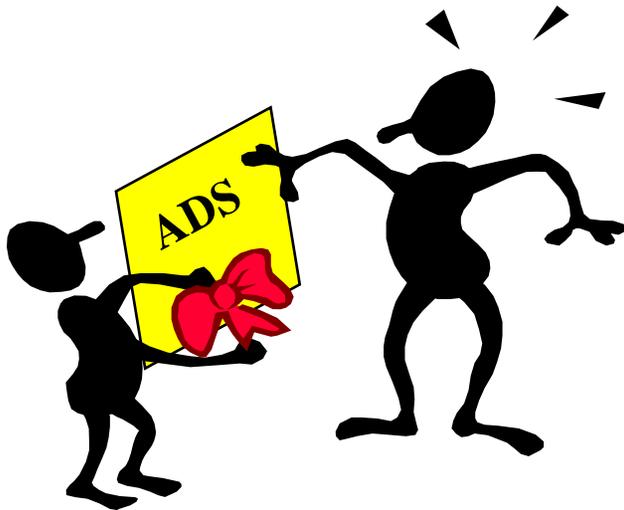

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## Who is Responsible for USAID Information Quality?

Me? Are you saying that I'm responsible for USAID information quality?



*Originating offices must review information products for compliance with USAID's Information Quality Guidelines (ADS 578) at every step, including the creation, collection, and maintenance of information, before it is disseminated.*

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## When Do USAID Data Quality Guidelines Apply?

*They apply when:*

- ▶ **USAID produces information mainly for public dissemination, not primarily for internal use;**
- ▶ **USAID or an implementing partner releases the information under USAID “sponsorship” – meaning the information is disseminated on USAID’s behalf, and**
- ▶ **The information represents USAID’s official position.**

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## To What Kinds of Documents Do these Standards Apply?

### *Planning and Management Information*

- Program policy and strategy planning documents.
- Program reviews
- Development activity analyses
- Design and authorization documents, **including data collected on PMP indicators**

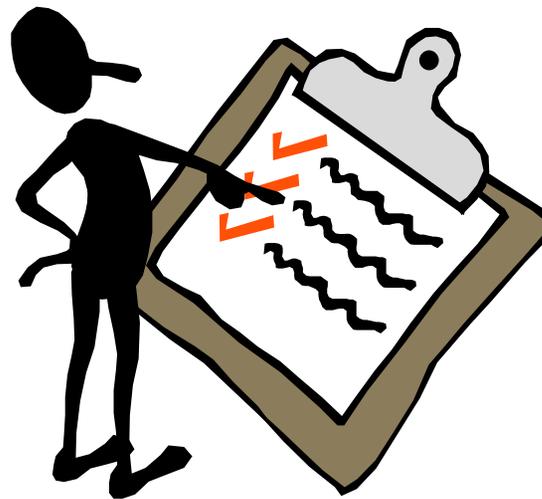
### *Programs, Products and Services Information*

- Program development activity performance, results and **evaluation reports.**
- Procurement and assistance opportunity announcements.

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## Be Systematic

### Standard by Standard



- **Validity**
- **Reliability**
- **Precision**
- **Integrity**
- **Timeliness**
- **Usefulness**

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## Validity

- ▶ **On the face of it, are the data logically linked to the result USAID is trying to measure or to an evaluation question?**
- ▶ **Did the data collection instruments focus on the information needed to answer the question or measure performance?**

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## Reliability

- ▶ **Did everyone who collects the data do it the same way? Were the data collectors adequately trained?**
- ▶ **Were the same procedures and instruments used at every site or every year (for measuring indicators)?**
- ▶ **If a sample was drawn, were the same sampling techniques used every time or in every location?**
- ▶ **Were the same data analysis processes used each time?**

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## Accuracy and Precision

- ▶ **Were answers vague (more, some) or was a count or percentage provided?**
- ▶ **Was a number of cases represented by a percentage indicated (N =)**
- ▶ **Were there expectations about accuracy (margin of error) ? 90% confidence that the data provide provide a true picture, +/- 5%.**
- ▶ **Were accuracy expectations met?**

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## **Integrity**

- ▶ **Is there any incentive that might encourage intentional manipulation of the data?**
- ▶ **What safeguards exist that protect against deliberate data manipulation?**
- ▶ **Were data checked when they were turned in and found to be error free?**
- ▶ **Were there opportunities for transcription errors and how were they handled?**

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## Timeliness

- ▶ **Did the evaluation authors meet their submission deadlines for draft and final reports?**
- ▶ **Were performance reports delivered on time?**

**Available frequently enough to be useful – *must be available every year, or automatically reported as a “data limitation”* (ADS 203.3.4.2)**

**Presented on a fiscal year basis -- automatically document as a data limitation if it is not – *must be available on a fiscal year basis, or automatically reported as a “data limitation.”* (ADS 203.3.8.2)**

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## Usefulness

- ▶ **Is the presentation of data or findings clear and easy for readers to understand.**
- ▶ **Is there a clear and logical relationship between data (findings) and conclusions and recommendations that are offered?**
- ▶ **Are recommendations practical and specific, rather than vague?**
- ▶ **Is it clear who needs to take action on each recommendation?**
